# Donning a Gown & Gloves Surgical Hand Scrub

The following are excerpts from employed caregiver policy provided to students and learners for onboarding compliance

# Why is proper donning and doffing and surgical hand scrubbing important?

As part of your onsite rotation with us an PRMCE, we have a goal of Zero Preventable Harm to our patients and caregivers. This training provides you with the basic education to keep both yourself and patients safe.

**Skill Focus:** Donning a surgical gown and gloves using aseptic technique.

#### **Objective:**

- 1. Demonstrate ability to don a surgical gown.
- 2. Demonstrate ability to don sterile surgical gloves
- 3. Demonstrate ability to turn the gown.

## Donning a Gown:

- 1. Approach the sterile field with caution.
- 2. Grasp the gown at the center near the neck without touching the gloves or the wrapper.
- 3. Lift the gown from the wrapper and step back with the gown still folded.
- 4. Hold the inside of the gown near the shoulders and allow the gown to unfold.
- 5. Begin donning the gown by slipping the hands and arms into the sleeves.
- 6. Slide the gown over the arms using a "swimming" motion.
- 7. Keep the hands within the cuff of the gown.
- 8. Flex the elbows to hold the gown in place.
- 9. Allow the circulator to assist with the final gown adjustments and secure the neck and back of gown.



## **Closed Gloving:**

- 1. Approach the sterile field with caution.
- 2. Secure the first glove, keeping the fingers within the cuff of the gown.
- 3. Align the glove on the palm of the hand that will be gloved first with the thumb side of the glove toward your palm and the fingertips toward the elbow.
- 4. Pull the cuff of the glove over the cuff of the gown.
- 5. Unfold the cuff of the glove to completely cover the cuff of the gown.
- 6. Grasp the glove and the gown at the wrist level.
- 7. Work the fingers into the glove as the glove is pulled into position.
- 8. Secure the second glove and apply using the same technique.
- 9. Double glove.



# Turning the Gown:

- 1. Remain facing the sterile field.
- 2. Secure the tag in the right hand and the gown tie in the left hand and separate.
- 3. Hold the tag in such a way that the circulator has space to grasp the tag.
- 4. Pass the tag to the circulator at the right side.
- 5. The circulator will move around to the left side.
- 6. Transfer the gown tie from the left to the right hand.
- 7. Receive the gown tie from the circulator at the left side.
- 8. The circulator retains and discards the tab.
- 9. Secure both gown ties.







#### **Skill Focus:** Surgical Hand Scrub

#### **Objective:**

1. Demonstrate a surgical hand scrub following principles of aseptic technique.



- 1. Proper attire. Scrub top tucked into scrub pants and if necessary, sleeve tops slightly rolled up.
- 2. All jewelry removed from hands, including watches and wedding rings.
- 3. Inspect integrity of hands and arms for cuts or infections.
- 4. Inspect fingernails and cuticles. No artificial nails or polish.
- 5. Open brush packet and place in convenient location.
- 6. Turn on the faucet (adjust temp) and wet hands and arms.
- 7. Apply antiseptic soap lather from fingertips to 2" above elbows. (basic hand wash)
- 8. Clean nails (subungual and around cuticle) with nail cleaner under running water. Discard nail cleaner.
- 9. Rinse hands and arms moving forward from fingertips to 2" above elbow.



- 10. Keep hands above elbows and elbows bent to allow water to run off elbows.
- 11. Using fingers, grab scrub brush without touch outside edge of packaging.
- 12. Begin scrubbing firsthand starting at fingertips, focusing on nails and cuticles.
- 13. Scrub each finger by dividing it into four planes.
- 14. Scrub each web space as a separate plane. Add antiseptic soap if necessary.
- 15. Scrub four planes of hand.
- 16. Divide arm into three sections and four planes scrubbing with circular motions. (bottom, middle, elbow)
- 17. Scrub 2" above elbow.
- 18. Transfer scrub brush to other hand and repeat process with opposite hand.



- 19. Discard brush.
- 20. Rinse hands and arms moving forward from fingertips to 2" above elbow one arm at a time.
- 21. Turn off water.
- 22. Keep hands above elbows and elbows bent to allow water to run off elbows.
- 23. Proceed to OR, using your back to open door, not touching anything.
- 24. Prepare to surface where gown and gloves are open and sterile.
