

What/who is Providence Mount St. Vincent?

Owned and operated by Providence Health & Services and following the heritage of the Sisters of Providence, Providence Mount St. Vincent opened its doors in 1924 as "St. Vincent's Home for the Aged" in Seattle, Washington. Today, the average age of residents is 94, and many are dependent upon staff to assist them with their daily living activities or require 24 hour nursing care. The Mount is recognized internationally as a leader in the industry because of our "person directed" care philosophy that invites residents to choose how they wish to live their lives. The Mount community becomes home in the truest sense of the word for each resident. Even pets are welcome. The Mount provides activities, programs and therapies to help all live as vibrantly and actively as possible.

The Mount is known as a national and international role model in changing the landscape of intergenerational relationships. People travel from all over the world to study our model. We have been pioneering blending young and old since the establishment of the Intergenerational Learning Center (ILC) in 1991. Today, the program connects 400 elders who make The Mount their home with 125 students who attend the ILC. Additionally, students from local middle schools, high schools and universities, and many other youth groups visit regularly.

The Intergenerational Learning Center (ILC).

The ILC is a licensed child care center, located within The Mount. The ILC serves children ages six weeks to 5 years or pre-kindergarten. Open five days a week from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., six bustling classrooms serve as home base and the children engage in many visits to resident neighborhood throughout the day.
